

TOWN OF LA RONGE

BYLAW NO. 439/03

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF LA RONGE
IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN
FOR THE PURPOSE OF REGULATING AND CONTROLLING
SMOKING IN MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS & VEHICLES

WHEREAS the Council for the Town of La Ronge deems it desirable to prohibit smoking in all municipal buildings and within 10 feet of any entrance door;

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to Section 142 of The Urban Municipality Act, 1984, R.S.S. 1978, the Council for the Town of La Ronge in open meeting hereby enacts as follows:

1. (a) No person shall use in any way or form any tobacco products or tobacco substitutes or smoking devices in any area of the following Town facilities:

Town Office/Library Building, at 1212 Hildebrand Drive;
Mel Hegland Uniplex, 1120 Hildebrand Drive;
Recycling Building, 420 Finlayson Street;
Town Maintenance Shop, 420 Finlayson Street;
Fire Hall; 1123 Hildebrand Drive;
Water Treatment Plant, 1103 La Ronge Avenue;
Sewage Treatment Plant, Part of Parcel J;
Air Terminal Building; La Ronge Airport;
Airport Maintenance Shop, La Ronge Airport;
Sewage Pumping Stations; and.
Water Reservoir Buildings.

- (b) No person shall use in any way or form any tobacco products or tobacco substitutes or smoking devices in any Town owned vehicle.

2. Any person within the above mentioned Town facilities shall, when requested to do so by any Town of La Ronge employee, extinguish any lit cigar, cigarette, pipe or other smoking device.
3. Any person who fails or refuses to extinguish any lit cigar, cigarette, pipe or other smoking device when requested to do so pursuant to Section 2 of this Bylaw is guilty of a violation of this Bylaw.
4. Any person who contravenes any provision of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Town of La Ronge.
5. Bylaw No. 432/03 of The Town of La Ronge is hereby repealed.
6. This Bylaw comes into force and takes effect on, from and after the final passing thereof.
